Featuring a Seven Night Cruise, Aboard the Beautiful Carnival Spirit sailing round-trip from Seattle, Washington

August 2 – 9, 2011

Think of shimmering glaciers and mountains that fill half the sky. Think of soaring eagles and thundering herds of caribou, calving glaciers, ice-blue water and snow-capped mountain tops. Join us for a voyage of discovery!

- Tuesday** A breathtaking seven-night cruise awaits! Everything is taken care of...all you have to do is unpack, relax and watch the magnificent scenery go by. Spend your time doing what pleases you, whether it be listening to Alaska naturalist & port lectures, relaxing in the hot tubs, or enjoying spa services. At night there are Las Vegas style shows, dance clubs, karaoke and piano bars. From breakfast in bed to lunch on the lido deck to dinner in the main dining room or the steakhouse, you'll always have a variety of dining options.
- Wednesday** Enjoy cruising along the Inside Passage, a "must see part of any Alaska cruise. It features virtually everything you came to see, including rain forests, glaciers, fjords, and white-capped peaks, all of which create a perfect setting to see whales and sea lions.
- Thursday** Today the ship will cruise through Tracy Arm Fjord. This 20-mile-long fjord, chiseled from Yosemite-like granite rocks, encompasses countless waterfalls, huge icebergs, and mountain peaks that reach more than 5,000 feet. It is one of two 25 mile long fjords with tidewater glaciers at the head leading off Holkham Bay, the other is Endicott Arm. Search the cliffs for mountain goats scaling the near-vertical rock faces, see black bears strolling the shores, and listen for the sounds of harbour seals hauled out on ice floes
- Friday** The gold rush was a boon to the port of Skagway - by 1898 it was Alaska's largest town with a population of about 20,000. The town's hotels, saloons, dance halls and gambling houses prospered, drawing Skagway residents as well as the 10,000 people living in the tent city of nearby Dyea. But when the gold yield dwindled in 1900, so did the population of Skagway as the miners quickly shifted to new finds in Nome. Skagway retains the flavor of the gold rush era, especially on Broadway, with its false-front buildings, and in the Trail of '98 Museum, with its outstanding collection of memorabilia. The ship docks in Skagway for 14 hours, giving you plenty of time to soak up the atmosphere, and take a ride on one of the oldest narrow-gauge railroads in existence.
- Saturday** The capital of Alaska, Juneau offers sightseeing opportunities such as a tram ride up Mr. Roberts for spectacular views, and a visit to Mendenhall Glacier, a meandering river of compressed blue ice that is 1/5 of a mile wide and hundreds of feet thick. Surrounded by rock, ice, water and forest, Juneau is built on a small strip of land between towering Mount Juneau and the Gastineau Channel. Although not accessible by road, it is the largest city in southeast Alaska with 30,000 people and home to a large fishing fleet. Cosmopolitan for its size, Juneau is a creator's paradise - home to artists, actors, poets, and writers who draw their inspiration from the Alaskan wilderness.
- Sunday** Ketchikan is Alaska's first city and is known as the "Salmon Capital of the World." It's built on steep hillsides along the water and features a colorful and bustling port. While here, be sure to experience the Tlingit Indian culture and their spectacular totem poles.
- Monday** Victoria, located on the southeastern tip of Vancouver Island, is a picture perfect city exuding old-world charm, with beautiful gardens and charming houses. Butchart Gardens is 50 acres of lavishly landscaped limestone quarry that were first developed in 1904 and now represents one of the finest examples of horticulture in the world.
