Caller / Cuer of the Month: Henry and Barbara Israel



We dancers in Central District are most fortunate to have excellent callers and cuers. This month Henry and Barbara Israel are our featured callers. Henry was kind enough to take time to write about his experiences in the thirty five years he has been calling. This couple is well respected throughout Central District and they are deserving of special recognition.

Henry and Barbara first met in the 6th grade and then started dating in high school where both graduated in 1964. Both attended Central State College, Barbara for classes, Henry for Barbara. They were married in April 1966. Henry entered the U.S. Army in May of 1966 and served 3 years while obtaining several accommodations and awards. Their son, Henry Jr. was born in July of 1969.

Henry was in the Life insurance business and had just been promoted to district manager when he and Barbara attended a company convention at the Arizona Biltmore in Phoenix in 1972, where Bob Fisk and his band were doing the company entertainment. Henry thought the square dancing part might be fun. Upon returning to Oklahoma City from the convention, he visited with Jean Calhoun about the square dancing. Jean, as it happened, was the membership chairman for Circle 8, so lessons followed immediately.

Henry and Barbara had been transferred to Tulsa but continued to come to Oklahoma City for the Circle 8 dances and started calling. He called his first tip in the spring of 1973 at the Circle 8 barn dance held at Dee and Imolee Wynn's, and called his first dance in Morrison, OK shortly thereafter. After returning to Oklahoma City, they started Tri-Century Twirlers in Edmond in 1975, then was transferred to Montana in 1976 where they called for a club in Chester, MT. They moved back to Oklahoma City in 1977 and started calling for Moore Promenaders where they called until work dictated a resignation in 1980. In the mean time, Henry & Barbara started calling for Circle 8 in September 1978, and then started calling for Fun Timers as well in June 1995. In February of 2003, they started calling for Star Promenaders in Lawton, OK.

Henry was one of the early members of Callerlab and then the American Callers Association, where he later became president. Henry is a charter member of the Oklahoma State Callers and Teachers Association and currently serves as president. He is a member and currently serves as treasurer of the Central District Callers and Cuers Association. Henry is an Accredited Caller Training Specialist, Certified Instructor, Certified Insurance Counselor, Certified Professional Insurance Agent, and Automotive Service Excellence Master Technician.

In addition to calling square dances, Henry loves to ride his Harley, drive fast cars and play poker. But first and foremost, Henry loves Jesus and is a born again Christian. Barbara enjoys making a house a home, leading and participating in a ladies Bible study group, is a dedicated born again Christian.

Henry and Barbara have accomplished many good things in square dancing and in their personal lives. They are well know and well liked throughout Central District. Not only is Henry's calling excellent, but as a couple they make square dancing fun! We appreciate their many contributions to Central District and to square dancing.
