the 20th. We hope to see you at all of these special dances.

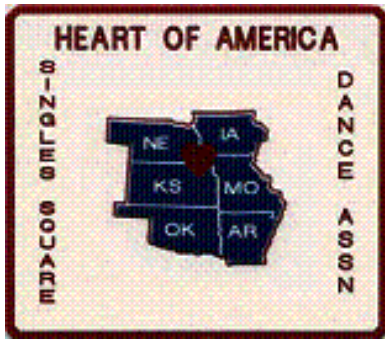

WHERE ARE CLAIMS FILED: Notify the Affiliate Insurance Chairman regarding any third party claims presented to the Club/Association. Chairman shall call U.S.D.A. National Insurance Coordinator with full description of incident.

### French Coconut Pie



Ingredients:

1 Stick, Butter

1 1/2 Cup Sugar

3 Eggs

1 Cup Coconut, packed

1 Tablespoon Vinegar

1 Tsp Vanilla

Pinch of salt

1 Pie shell

Directions: Cream sugar and butter well. Add eggs, one at a time, and mix. Add Coconut, Vinegar, Vanilla and a pinch of salt. Stir. Pour into pie shell and bake for 1 hour @ 350 degrees. Serve pie warm.
