Caller/Cuer Corner: Jim and DeDe Howard

Although this article is 15 years old it still holds very true to this day and time.

From American Square Dance Magazine, January 1995, by Bill and Bobbie Davis:

“One of the most obvious and sometimes troublesome problems encountered in the process of integrating new members into a group of experienced dancers, is that of coping with the various degrees of experience and competence in the dancers. The situation also occurs when experienced dancers are intermingled with dancers who are learning the level for the first time.

Those dancers who have had previous experience at the level can be of most help by remembering that a learning situation is made easier if there is no confusion of instructions and a minimum of distractions for the learner. The natural inclination is often for the more knowledgeable dancer to try to help by giving verbal directions to the newcomer or even by attempting to physically steer the learner to the right spot. In the long run, however, it is best for all concerned if the experienced dancers refrain from the urge to vocalize directions and let everyone concentrate on the instructions and directions from the caller.

If personal assistance within a square is deemed appropriate a simple silent gesture toward the right position or direction is the most effective. Such a course of action will usually preserve goodwill within the square and avoid bruised feeling (and even bruised bodies) that can easily result from more aggressive assistance. Since part of the appeal of square dancing is the feeling of accomplishment that comes with “getting it right,” it is best to allow a weaker dancer the opportunity for success on his/her own.

At the same time, the less experienced dancer needs to keep in mind the fact that efforts to help are not intended as any personal criticism. The thing to remember is that everyone wants the square he/she is in to succeed, and in square dancing all eight people must reach the right position in order for the square to make it. Less experienced dancers should recognize that the desire to succeed is often strong in experienced dancers. It would be well, then, for the “novice” to be somewhat tolerant of the others whose intensity perhaps causes them to be “pushy” or overly helpful.

A complication sometimes occurs when the experienced dancer, who is trying to help, is wrong. This is always a tough situation. If incorrect “help” occurs occasionally, the best course is to forget it. Even very good dancers are not perfect. If it persists, the best way to cope with it is to work through the call or instructor. He/She is recognized to be the group authority, and as such is in the best position to handle the problem in a professional manner with a minimum of hurt feelings. It would, of course, be nice if everyone were very mature and aware of personal limitations as well as capabilities. But it is not a perfect world, so we do our best. **Our golden rule is: Help others as you would have them help you; accept help as you would like your help to be taken.** And if someone rejects your help, don’t pout and withdraw; keep smiling it’s only a game.

The thing that everyone should keep in mind is that a **subtle helping hand** is the best kind and when extended should be accepted graciously.”

Message from Education Director: Handholds - Why and How

Many of the country's best callers teach their dancers how important it is for dancers to maintain contact with one another. They insist that dancers should take hands as soon as possible after any movement that separates them. When a caller calls for a club that he is not familiar with, he always watches carefully during his first tip to see what the dancers do with their hands. If they are making maximum use of their hands, he knows that he can call things to them that they couldn't handle if they didn't.

Some of the good things that keeping in contact can do for the dancers are:

- Help them to find their proper position in the set's formation.
- Help them keep track of what the set as a whole is doing (formation awareness).
- Help keep them together time-wise.
- Make it easier for the more experienced dancers to assist or cue the others (guiding but not pushing or yanking, of course).
- Encourage the dancers to keep the set neat and compact.

One more benefit of the use of proper handholds is to give the dancers the feeling of dancing with each other instead of around each other. They get this feeling from a certain amount of pressure in the hold, which means that the dancers are helping each other control their momentum. If they have to do it entirely by themselves, it can only be done through the contact of the dancer's feet with the floor. But the pressure in a handhold is applied to the shoulder, so just a little pressure can make a real difference in the amount of energy the dancers expend. The lack of this pressure is what people mean when they talk about a "dead-fish" handhold, or the lack of "resistance".

Another unpleasant feature of handholds is roughness, which means that a man (It's usually the man, but not always) applies awkward or painful forces to a lady. In most cases he can't do it unless his hold is really a strong grip. And he can't take a strong grip except by clenching something between his fingers and opposed thumb. So, the way to prevent roughness is to teach the dancers, particularly the men, to keep their thumbs out of the action when they take handholds.

Proper handholds should be taught to new dancers from the very beginning of the class. When dancers square up and learn Mainstream Call Number 1, namely Circle Left, they should also learn the first principle of handholds: "Men's palms up, ladies palms down."

Square Dance Couple of the Month: Jim and Ruth Ford

Here is a fireside chat with Jim and Ruth Ford, our featured square dance couple for January. Jim and Ruth are the ideal square dance couple. Their friendly, vivacious energy exemplifies their leadership ability in the square and round dance arena, as well as their many and varied interests and activities.

Jim and Ruth live in Oklahoma City and are members of Silver Spur – OKC. They reluctantly took lessons with Silver Spur in 1963 when Gerald McWhirter scheduled a set of 10 lessons. Ruth had never

danced but Jim grew up in a square dance family. His father was a caller years ago when there was a caller in each square on the floor.

Jim and Ruth knew one square dance couple in the Silver Spur Square Dance Club of OKC. Al and Nola begged Jim and Ruth to take square dance lessons. In March 1963 lessons began. Ruth went



reluctantly with Jim to the first lesson as promised with the intention of having no fun at all. However, it was fun and Ruth was on the phone the next day calling everyone she could think of to take square dance lessons. And, now, for the rest of the story!

Jim and Ruth graduated after 8 lessons just in time to attend the Jamboree in May at the Civic Center. They immediately accepted an appointed office on the Silver Spur Board. Six months later they were elected President of Silver Spur and then elected to serve as President another six months. They lived, loved, learned a lot and still cherish those memories. The next year, with encouragement and mentoring from the greatest square dance leaders in Oklahoma, Guy and Sue Gentry, Howard and Peggy Thornton, John and Opal

Bowlware, Al and Vera Sue Miller, Pete and Ester Hughes and Chet and Billie Ferguson - just to mention a few - Jim and Ruth were elected to serve on the State Federation of Square Dance Clubs, (known now as OSDF). They served three years in the 1960's. Jim and Ruth again served on the OSDF Board for two years in 2007 and 2008 as 3rd Vice President. Great fun!

On the National level they have attended 17 Conventions; modeled at four conventions; served as Tour Director for the 1978 National Convention and Fashion Show Director for the 1989 National Convention. They are registered and encourage everyone to register for the 2013 National Convention to be held in Oklahoma City. They are on the Sooner Board as Director of Ceremonies. We heard them say, "If you love it, you promote it!"

On the District level Jim and Ruth served on several committees during the time Jim was calling for Saint Mark's Twirlers, Fun Timers and Norman Buckaroos. Still, although not a caller for hire, Jim belongs to the CD Callers and OSDF Callers Associations and enjoys the fun of putting the needle down on a record and calling a tip.
