Square Dance Couple of the Month: Vernon and Lois Willis

The Central District Square Dance Couple for July is Vernon and Lois Willis from Choctaw. Vernon and Lois have served in many offices for their club, Happy Tracks, and for Central District. They have long served on the Central District Executive Board and currently are the Publicity Directors. We square dancers in Central District are very fortunate to have dedicated couples like Vernon and Lois who work tirelessly to promote our hobby.



The first time for square dancing for Vernon and Lois Willis was during Vernon's senior year of high school. He contacted a square dance caller out of Coffeyville, Kansas, who agreed to come to Lenapah, Oklahoma to teach square dance lessons. Vernon remembers the lessons being held

for the high school youth in an upstairs hall above an old abandoned bank. This is where Vernon and Lois first learned how to square dance. More important, this is when and where they got the bug to square dance.

Vernon and Lois got married two years later on August 17, 1958, while attending college. Between Lois having five daughters, they somehow managed to continue to square dance. It was one of the first activities they looked for when they moved to a new community. Square dancing was where they met a lot of friendly people. Both Vernon and Lois taught school after graduating from college. Vernon taught in elementary school and was responsible for physical education. He often taught square dancing to six graders as a physical exercise activity.

Vernon and Lois took lessons from various callers and joined a variety of clubs over the years. All five of their daughters learned how to square dance and helped them out in the clubs. Square dancing for them was a family affair.

When Vernon & Lois moved to Oklahoma County in 1973, they and three other couples from Vernon's work decided to take square dance lessons from Jim Howard Sr. at Kelly Kapers. They continued to dance there until the Happy Tracks club was organized in Nicoma Park with Dick Manning as the caller.

During the next 28 years Vernon and Lois served in all offices of Happy Tracks, most a number of times, including the office of president. As in most clubs, lessons were given at least once a year and they were always angels for these lessons. Except for a period of time that they took away from the club to operate their pizza restaurant in Choctaw, they were active in all club activities. The past five years they have also served on the Central District Executive Board in various elected and appointed positions.

Even with Lois's cancer problems where she now cannot dance, Vernon and Lois have stayed active in Happy Tracks as well as in Central District activities. As you would say, the two of them have kept involved with square dancing through thick and thin. As CD Publicity Directors for the second year in a row, the office has kept both of them busy. They want to thank all the callers and dancers for making square dancing fun and a special part of their lives.

Vernon and Lois are the first couple we have honored as the Square Dance couple of the Month. As you can see, they are very deserving of this honor. They obviously love square dancing and serve as an example of how we all must work hard to promote our hobby. Dedicated people like them are the ones

who keep square dancing alive and well. Thank you Vernon and Lois for your many contributions to Happy Tracks and to Central District.

Caller/Cuer Corner: Leadership - The act of leading

Square dancing is made up of several families. We have dancers as well as cuers, callers and square dance associations in our family. All of these people are doing their part to improve our great hobby. All dancers and square dance organizations are leaders by definition. With this in mind, What is the act of leading?

Webster defined the word “leadership” as “the act of leading.” Ralph Nader says, “The function of leadership is to produce more leaders, not more followers.” In *The 21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership*, John Maxwell sums up his definition of leadership as, ‘**leadership is influence – nothing more, nothing less.**’ My test of leadership is “If you look behind you and no one is following then you are not a leader.” Since leadership is influence, then we must look at our leaders and their ability to influence others. The final test of a leader is what they leave behind in others so that they have the character and conviction to carry on.

Leadership usually reflects four main themes:

1. Getting things done
2. Building relationships
3. Creating a “Can Do” attitude
4. Teaching leadership to others.

Are you one of the people who can influence others to get things done? Are you one of the people who get things done? Thinking of yourself as a square dance leader do you exhibit sufficient trust or authority to motivate others to achieve a shared objective? When it comes to creating a “can do attitude” leadership is manifested through relationships of trust and common benefit. Relationships built on trust do not come over night but rather are built over time. Are you building relationships or just doing your own thing? Are you a teacher? “Leaders create leaders who create leaders”. Are you training and teaching leadership to someone to take your place? Are you training them to do a better job and/or be better leaders than yourself? Great leadership comes from great leaders teaching others.

Being a square dance leader requires that we attempt to create new behaviors, new meaning and new ideas without the fear of failure. We must be motivated by the love of service to all the family, not power. Just like all families, we must all be leaders in our activity and pull together if our family of square dancing is to survive. The whole must be greater than the sum of the parts. Is anyone following you?
